Attendance Guidance 2020-2021 School Year

Typically, student attendance is based solely on a student's physical presence in a traditional classroom. In 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, school districts have been educating students through a variety of learning platforms. In these times, physical presence is often an insufficient measure of students attendance.

Modified Definition for Student Attendance

- Being present for learning opportunities:
- A student is present for learning when they demonstrate evidence of engagement with instructional content.
 - *A student is physically present in their classroom
 - *A student has consistent online interaction with teachers and peers.

In-Person Classroom Attendance

- A student is present in their assigned classroom, when they are physically present and able to participate in the learning opportunities provided by the teacher.
- Tardiness and missing part of the day will represent a tardy/half day absences.
- In-Person students will abide by existing Preston County Schools Attendance Policy.
- Any NON-COVID 19 absences still requires a parent or doctor note.
- Unexplained absences will be unexcused.

COVID-19 Absence Allowance

- A parent /guardian will immediately notify the school by phone at the onset of the circumstance.
- A student will be excused if they are:
 - *Quarantined for two (or more weeks) due to a positive COVID 19 test.
 - *Had close contact with someone who has tested positive.
 - * A family member has had contact with someone who has tested positive.
- For the absence to be considered excused, the student should continue to engage in learning lessons via the remote learning platform. An exception is when the student is ill from COVID and needs time on the return to school to make up their work.
- Any student absent due to a positive COVID test or has had close contact with someone who tested positive to COVID should contact the school regarding re-entry.

Virtual School/Remote Learning Days

- Take place outside of the physical school building and are presented by the student's teacher.
- A mix of real time and individual assignments.
- A child is present for virtual/remote learning if the student.
 - 1. Logs in and participates in provided learning opportunities.
 - 2. Completes assigned daily learning opportunities by the teacher.
- All students MUST participate in a weekly check-in conference with their Virtual School teacher or staff member.
- ⇒ If connectivity or technology issues prevent a student from being present for virtual/distance learning, the family must contact the school as quickly as possible to arrange corrective action and possible make-up assignments for the missed learning days.
